


What Do We Mean?



Adora Svitak




- Wrote two books

Jason Li - 15


- Won Next Teen Tycoon online video competition as 15 yr old

European Inventor of the Year Award, 2014 Fellow of the Royal Society and Royal Academy of Engineering (exceedingly rare achievement)








